Kelsey Hagan received the VCU Institute for Research on Behavioral and Emotional Health (IRBEH) Pilot Grant.

The grant title is "Deciphering the Cognitive Mechanisms of Risk-taking in Emerging Adults with Eating Disorders in the Spit for Science Study: A Computational Approach."

The project's funds support a Spit for Science spin-off study that will provide detailed neurocognitive phenotyping of risk-taking among VCU undergraduates with eating disorders and also provide mechanistic insights into other risky behaviors (including substance use, suicidal thoughts, and behaviors) that are common among this group. The IRBEH grant will also serve as a platform for mentorship for research trainees, particularly undergraduate research interns.

Mechanism: DoD Traumatic Brain Injury and Psychological Health Research Program (TBIPHRP) award with Ananda Amstadter, other VIPBG/Psychiatry department colleagues, and PM&R department colleagues. Three-year Investigator-Initiated Research Award (IIRA)

Objective: The study aims to characterize the genetic architecture of persistent post-concussive symptoms (PPCS), PTSD, and AUD and to examine the gene-environment interplay (for example, blast exposure, cumulative trauma) over time in service members and veterans.
