The Virginia Naloxone Project: How Narcan in EDs is saving lives from opioid overdoses A life-saving strategy equipping at-risk patients with naloxone nasal spray before leaving the hospital is being led by clinician-researchers at VCU Medical Center.



"By focusing on a patient population that we were already treating, we could easily provide patients with the medication and teach them how to use it," said Wills, who is also a professor in the Virginia Commonwealth University School of Medicine's departments of Psychiatry and Emergency Medicine. "Overall, giving at-risk patients the tools to potentially help themselves and others struggling with opioid use disorder (OUD) can help combat the opioid epidemic." Brandon Wills, DO, FASAM, FAACT, medical director of VCU Health's MOTIVATE Clinic, believes there is another way to get this life-saving medication into the hands of those who need it most – provide it to patients for free in the emergency department.
